The following report has been created in compliance with the crime Awareness and Campus Security Act of 1990 to inform all employees and students of crime awareness and to explain the procedures to be used in reporting criminal actions at the College.

The College facility is open between the hours of 7 a.m. and 9:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Friday, and 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays.

In reporting any perceived criminal activity at the College during a typical day, **Monday through Friday between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.**, please see Eleanor Noriel, Director of Administrative Services, Ken Castor, Maintenance Supervisor, Vickie A. Savino, Director of Education, or Roy Hurd, President, and **Monday through Thursday between 5 p.m. and 10 p.m.**, please see Lynda Bascom, Evening School Dean. The college is also patrolled by a security guard from 7:00 p.m. thru 11:00 p.m. In the event that these individuals are unavailable, seek out another Empire College employee for assistance or call 911 for immediate professional aid, or contact the local police. In all instances, the person reporting the action will complete an incident report provided by the College.

We encourage all students and employees to be responsible for their security and the security of others, ask that everyone be aware, and report any suspicious situations to the above security personnel.

Our policies concerning drug and alcohol use/awareness are contained in separate documentation presented to the new students and employees at orientation.

Empire College can refer students to off-campus counseling for mental health and services for victims of sex offenses. Please refer to Attachment D of the Drug-Free Awareness/Drug Prevention Program for a partial listing of these programs. Empire College does not provide any on-campus program.
