GRADE DETERMINATION:	The grade will be based on the results of the final examination, with up to five points added as appropriate for classroom participation. Classroom participation includes being prepared to brief cases when called upon, and making concise, cogent contributions to class discussions.															
CLASS PREPARATION:	Students must come to class prepared to discuss the material assigned. They will be asked to brief cases in alphabetical order based on the class roll list. <b>Students are expected to prepare the first assignment before the first class session.</b>															
ATTENDANCE:	A minimum of 80% attendance is required (11 classes). This means that no more than 20% of the total class hours can be missed (2 classes).															
GOALS:	To give the student a working knowledge of California Community Property law, including but not limited to the following: identification and characterization of marital property and debts; valuation of community property assets; division of marital assets and debts upon dissolution of marriage; management and control of community property; special issues concerning non-marital cohabitation, real estate, business assets, deferred compensation, bankruptcy, and tax consequences of community property division.															
PREREQUISITES:	Satisfactory completion of all first and second year courses.
