Course Description:	Students will research, write, and argue an appellate brief before a mock appellate court. This course emphasizes effective research and writing techniques and introduces students to making oral arguments in court.
Class Attendance:	Students must attend 100% of the classes (30 hours; 15 of 15 classes) and participate in oral arguments.
Class Preparation :	There is a great deal of material to cover in this class. Students must complete a brief that is 100% original research, and then defend that brief in oral argument.
Grading Policy:	This is a Pass/Fail class. The grade is based upon the brief and the oral argument. The brief must meet the standards of submission to an appellate court. The oral argument must also meet appellate standards.
Grade Determination:	The brief must adequately discuss the facts of the case and the applicable law. It must be free of typographical and grammatical errors. The student must make an oral argument.
